 Six young new or expecting single mothers ages 18 to 21 who are being helped by the outreach program of Noah's Anchorage, a branch of the Channel Islands YMCA;

 Three boys and three girls ages 11 to 17 who are residents at the Noah's Anchorage youth shelter;

 28 aged, partially disabled or low-income single adults who live at the PSHH Victoria Hotel.

All Saints parishioners work with the parent organizations mentioned above and can vouch for the condition and needs of the recipients.

### 'Lesson & Carols' Services Planned for December 8



The Advent "Lessons & Carols" service is planned for 10 a.m. Sunday, December 8, at All Saints. Join the choir and musicians of All Saints-by-the-Sea at this traditional worship experience. In this service, we listen to Scripture lessons, which recount the Fall, the promise of a Messiah and the Incarnation. Each lesson is followed by a carol or choir anthem that reflects the lesson's message. "This year, each lesson will be preceded by the chanting of one of the ancient monastic 'O-Antiphons,' which bids the coming of the Savior," said Music Director Steve O'Connor.

Also, a 7 p.m. Lessons & Carols service will be held at St. Michael's University Church in Isla Vista. The service will include music by a combined choir with members from area Episcopal churches, including All Saints. St. Michael's is on the corner of Camino Pescadero and El Greco Road.

### Parish School Student Leads Food Drive

Charlie LeRenard, a 5-year-old student at All Saints Preschool, had an idea to help feed people that do not have money to buy food. The Parish School staff felt it was a great idea and our preschool, helped by donations from parishioners on November 17, collected and donated 643 pounds of non-perishable items to the FoodBank of Santa Barbara County in one week.



The idea came up while Charlie was having breakfast one morning and his mother told him that some children that don't have enough to eat will go to school hungry. Charlie said he thought was horrible and was visibly upset by that notion, his mother said. His mother asked Charlie if he would like to do something about it and the idea for the food drive was born. Parish School staff, the parent Council and All Saints parishioners all pitched in and by the end of last week, the 643 pounds of non-perishable food was picked up and trucked to the FoodBank.
