The Wise Women of the parish will gather for this month’s program on Sunday, March 23 at 11:30 a.m. in the Parish Hall for another thought-provoking program.


Well over half a million people have viewed this online TED Talk by Pulitzer Prize winning journalist Amanda Bennett, in which she gives a sweet yet powerful talk on why, for the loved ones of the dying, having hope for a happy ending shouldn’t warrant a diagnosis of “denial.” She calls for a more heroic narrative for death; one that matches the narratives we have in life. The talk is based in part on Bennett’s book, “The Cost of Hope.” The book is part-memoir, part-investigative report, and recalls her seven-year struggle within the American healthcare system to save her husband from cancer.

Habitat for Humanity Work Day Update

Thank you to all who have signed up to work at the Habitat for Humanity project from 9 a.m. to noon this Saturday. All volunteers should arrive at the site, 822 E. Canon Perdido Street between 8:30 and 8:45 a.m. to park, fill out liability release forms, sign-in and become familiar with the site before the safety and work briefing at 9 a.m. Volunteers younger than 16 will go with a parent to another location nearby where they will work on projects for the new homes.

Please wear clothes that will probably get dirty, including long pants and closed-toe shoes (for safety). Bring snacks and drinks as desired. Water will be provided. Expected tasks include much painting, "green" jobs like caulking holes and joints, attaching cabinet hardware, hammering and nailing, small carpentry jobs and landscaping prep. Tools and instruction will be provided.
