Partnership Program-Episcopal Diocese of Haiti - in 2012 All Saints parishioners supported the construction of an elementary school in St. Cyprian, Haiti that had been destroyed in the earthquake of 2010

Global AIDS & Interfaith Alliance - provided home care kits, mosquito nets and other AIDS treatment support in Malawi, Africa **\$2,000**

The American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem - acts as a partner with the Diocese of Jerusalem by helping to increase its capacity to teach and held. AFEDJ raises funds for, and promotes the humanitarian work of, the Diocese of Jerusalem and its institutions so it may better serve the needs of all people in Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Palestine and Israel. **\$1,500**

United Way of Santa Barbara County/Fun in the Sun Program - presents an integrated series of planned educational, artistic, relational, an recreational activities to strengthen skills that would otherwise languish during the summertime and give children the sense of connectedness, life skills, and self-respect they need to produce behavioral and academic improvements. **\$3,000**

Best Day Foundation - enables children with physical or developmental special needs in our communities to build confidence and self-esteem through adventure

activities which stretch their limits, expand their true potential, and connect them with their community. **\$1,000**

Family Service Agency - our mission is to strengthen and advocated for families and individuals of all ages and diversities, helping to create and preserve a healthy community. One of the strengths is collaboration with other local health and human services agencies such as Friendship Center, CALM, the Boys and Girls Club, Girls Inc. and Transition House. **\$5,000**

Hearts Therapeutic Equestrian Center - Hearts employs the power of horsemanship to increase the capabilities and independence of adults and children with special needs. Hearts empowers residents of Santa Barbara who face severe physical, mental or emotional challenges due to illness, injury, disability, abuse or ageing. **\$1,500**

Mental Wellness Center - founded in 1947 to advance mental wellness in Santa Barbara County through practical programs for recovery of overall healthy, mental health education, and family services to strengthen primary relationships. Services are tailored to individuals' needs and several programs can be accessed concurrently to promote the greatest potential for mental wellness. **\$3,000**

Casa Serena - Casa Serena's mission is to provide effective treatment services and a safe, sober living environment to women seeking recovery from the diseases of alcoholism and drug addiction. **\$5,000**

Community Counseling and Education Center - The Spanish Speaking Families Project serves some of the most marginalized people in the Santa Barbara community, many of whom have no other access to counseling and educational

services. This program offers expert services to heal trauma and give children and parents a vision for a healthy and loving family. **\$3,000**

Santa Barbara Education Foundation - Mobile Waterford English Competency Program provides kindergarten readiness and English-language instruction for four-years -olds in the neighborhoods where they live. The program supports a bookmobile-style van outfitted with 8 computer stations and the Waterford literacy software program designed for children who lack English-language fluency.

Storyteller Center - serves the community's most vulnerable children whose parents suffer from risk factors such as poverty, substance abuse, and domestic violence. Almost all live below the federal poverty level. **\$2,500**

Peoples' Self-Help Housing - established with the mission to provide affordable housing and programs leading to self-sufficiency for low-income families, seniors, and other special needs groups on the Central Coast. This project help provide 40 children a summer educational enrichment program for residents in the Carpinteria apartments. **\$6,500**

Peoples' Self-Help Housing - community garden at Dahlia Court, Carpinteria **\$ 500.**

Hospital Hospitality House of Santa Barbara, Inc. (The Little Cottage) - provides overnight accommodations on a priority basis for non-local families of Cottage Hospital patients. All Saints members participated in creating Hospital Hospitality Houses and several original organizers remain as Board members. **\$2,000**

Episcopal Campus Ministry UCSB-St. Michael's University Church - augments St. Michael's 2013 operating funds and the many programs it offers. **\$4,500**

Transition House - our annual contribution for bus passes used by resident to go to work or look for work. **\$ 800.**
