

CELEBRATION OF CANDLEMAS

This morning we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, also known as Candlemas. It is one of the most ancient celebrations of the church, dating from the fourth century. In it, we recall one of the early episodes in Jesus' life.

According to the gospel, Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after his birth to complete Mary's ritual purification after childbirth, and to perform the redemption of the firstborn, in obedience to the Law of Moses. Upon bringing Jesus into the temple, they encountered Simeon. The Gospel records that Simeon had been promised that "he should not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ" (Luke 2:26). Simeon prayed the prayer that would become known as the Nunc Dimittis, or Canticum of Simeon, which

prophesied the redemption of the world by Jesus:


Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace; according to Thy word: for mine eyes have seen Thy salvation, which Thou hast prepared before the face of all people: to be a light to lighten the gentiles and to be the glory of Thy people Israel.
 (Luke 2:29-32)

From this is derived the annual custom of blessing the candles in the church, known as Candlemas, a Feast of Light.
