LENT AT ALL SAINTS

The season of Lent offers us a gracious opportunity to examine our lives in order to identify where we fall short and to turn our wills back toward God, whose nature is always to have mercy. Lent is an occasion to consider our spiritual health and deepen our spiritual lives. We do this by choosing well our Lenten disciplines that leads us more deeply into relationship with God and one another. This Lent, All Saints offers many opportunities to deepen your walk with Christ. Through seasonal opportunities for worship, devotion, and study, we hope you will find yourself not only willing but able to please God and participate more fully in the work of God's kingdom.

The Lenten Season Begins This Week With Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is this week, **February 18**, marking the beginning of the Lenten Season. Imposition of ashes will be offered at **noon and at 7:30 p.m.** in an effort to accommodate varying schedules. Please note: no Eventide on Ash Wednesday.

A helpful lesson from our Jewish and Muslim cousins: take the day off from work and school to observe our holy day of penitence and fasting.

Eventide During Lent

Our weekly Eventide service is a time where the All Saints' Community of God's friends gathers to pray, share, sing, rejoice and become, as God calls us. Modeled after the ancient Vespers Office, the service revolves around ancient symbols, interpretive "windows" into the presence of the transcendent God. Everyone is invited to the Wednesday 6:00 p.m. Eventide, as we experience the ancient symbols and retell the ancient stories of this Holy Season of Lent.

Lenten Quiet Day - Saturday, February 28, 9:00am-2:00pm

Lent allows us a wonderful opportunity to quiet our minds and grow closer to God. We have a special time set aside at All Saints this month to enhance our spiritual journey through this especially prayerful time of the year. You are invited to experience a Lenten Quiet Day to add to the meaningfulness of the Lenten journey. We will gather on Saturday, February 28, from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. The day will include a gathering time in the Parish House for coffee and muffins; three opportunities for individual prayer and contemplation; gathered discussion; Eucharistic worship; and lunch catered by Connie Lindberg. Treat yourself to this time of self-care, fellowship, and alone time with God. You will leave refreshed and inspired! The suggested donation for the day is \$10.00. J9IN THE MADNESS! LENT MADNESS RETURNS TO ALL SAINTS

If you are looking for a Lenten discipline that is fun, educational, occasionally goofy, and always joyful, join the Lent Madness journey! Lent needn't be all doom and gloom. After all, what could be more joyful than a season specifically set aside to get closer to God? Join the Rev. Vicki Mouradian as she leads Team All Saints through Lenten Madness.

Based loosely on the popular NCAA basketball tournament, Lent Madness pits 32 saints against one another in a single-elimination bracket as they compete for the coveted Golden Halo. But it is more than that: Lent Madness is really an online devotional tool designed to help people learn about saints.

On the weekdays of Lent information is posted at www.lentmadness.org about two different saints, and then participants vote online to determine who goes on to the next round. Sixteen saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the Golden Halo. Saintly Scorecards (suggested donation \$2) are available this morning on the Information Table. A brackett will be displayed on the patio to help you track the madness. Lenten Formation Series: Called to Life

Have you wondered where God is calling you? In the Episcopal Church, baptism is understood as becoming a full member in the Body of Christ. As baptized members of the Body of Christ, we all have ministries to which we are called - our "baptismal vocation." In the midst of life's busyness, we don't always give ourselves time to reflect on the deeper meaning of our lives in light of our faith. This Lenten season, you are invited to participate in *Called to Life*, an adult formation series where we will explore how to listen for God and why we are all called to serve others.

During this free, six-part series we will gather together with the intention of deepening our connections between faith and everyday life, exploring vocation in relation to our whole lives. Join the conversation! Come explore Scripture and learn a new prayer practice, build relationships, share your story and listen to others' stories to gain perspective on your own call to baptismal ministry.

GIVING PUT PF GRATITUDE FPR GPD'S GIFTS

At our Annual Meeting, we heard from Rev. Aimée that we are just beginning our ministry together, perched on the edge of what God will do with and through us. What this will be is still ours to discover together, and is a task both exhilarating and daunting. We acknowledged that there will be some challenging times



 including overcoming some difficult financial realities. The need to discuss our church's financial reality was fitting so that we can overcome it together, grounding our solution in the common purpose and mission to which God calls us.

Chip Nichols offered an important way forward: "If every one of our 420 member households gave \$750 over and above

whatever they have already pledged for 2015, it would erase the \$315,000 deficit we are budgeting." Rev. Aimée did so and invited others to join.

We know not everyone can make this additional \$750 pledge, and some can do much more. But giving out of gratitude for God's good gifts to us is something everyone can do. Your outgoing and current vestry & clergy have also met the challenge and pledged a total of \$8,450 toward closing our deficit. Please prayerfully give as generously as you can to be a part of the solution.

Pledge cards are available in the pews this morning, or you are also invited to call the church office. As we move forward as a household of God, we will walk forward in faith together, confident that God calls us to the place where our deep gladness and the world's hunger meet.
