Please do what makes you feel comfortable. **Holy Communion:** All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

Cleveland Elementary School is a yearround school, and home to approximately 380 students, grades K-6, most of whom are eligible for free breakfast and lunch. Unlike other schools in Santa Barbara, Cleveland does not benefit from the local tax base. In 2014. Cleveland was chosen as our parish's focus project. Opportunities to serve this important ministry include: becoming a homework tutor; assisting the school office with administrative help; assisting the PTA; helping in the library; gardening on the weekends; joining the "lunch bunch", eating lunch with the children periodically; or serving as an advocate for the school and neighborhood at City Hall. Have you been gathered in beloved community? Have you known the dark night of the soul? Have you ever been lost? Have you ever been found? Have you been set ablaze by the Light of Christ?

If you have answered yes, then you have discovered the **Paschal Mystery**. Christ's death and resurrection, what we call the Paschal Mystery, is the **heart of Christianity**, and it is the life-saving center of our own lives and stories. It is indeed a mystery how the love of Christ, made known to us on the cross, and the transforming power of God, revealed in the resurrection, saves us, but we know that they do. Christ's Paschal Mystery finds us in the darkness of our human life, gathers us in beloved community, and makes us, once again, **a new creation**.

This Holy Week, we experience the life-saving mysteries of Christ's death and resurrection anew. The services of Holy Week are the most meaningful and life-changing services of the year for many. During Holy Week, we not only remember Christ's saving acts for us, but we enter into the Paschal Mystery. We participate in the very acts of Christ's passion, so that on Easter we **become God's Resurrection people**, agents of God's transforming love to this broken world.

**EASTER SUNDAY** Alleluia! Christ has Risen! Today we celebrate the victory of Christ's resurrection. All are invited to a champagne reception following each service this morning. Equally attractive non-alcoholic beverages will also be available.

Next Sunday, April 12 a special 10am worship service, inviting for all ages, is planned! The children will sing and the gospel will be presented for children. Please plan to worship on Sunday to help celebrate such a magnificent milestone! No Sunday School this Sunday.
