## FINDING YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SERVICE

The worship bulletin will be your basic guide through this service's liturgy. Hymns: the hymn numbers are listed on the Hymn Board at the front of the church as well as in the bulletin. The Hymnal is the blue book in the pew rack in front of you. The Lessons: You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries, or you may follow along with the scripture readings in the bulletin. The Book of Common Prayer: This smaller red book in the pew rack is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians. Prayer: You will find that some people stand in prayer while others kneel. Please do what makes you feel comfortable. Holy Communion: All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

July 29 - Imitation Game


## SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL SCHEDULE

## ALL HANDS ?N DECK F?R THE M-4 SUMMER PR?JECT BACKPACKS F?R AREA CHILDREN

The M-4 (Montecito 4) Churches are pleased to announce the summer service project - providing backpacks stuffed with critical supplies for school success to local children in need. These children are living in People's Self Help Housing communities and rely on these learning tools. Together with the other M-4 Churches, our goal is to provide backpacks and supplies to 310 children.

On Saturday, July 25 Montecito Covenant will host our M-4 day of service from 10am-Noon where we will stuff the backpacks. Volunteers are needed for this day and donations are greatly needed, as each church as been asked to raise \$3,500 for this project by July 25. A donation of \$45 will give one child a backpack and the majority of supplies needed to have a successful start to the school year. Please consider giving the gift of a backpack or two to help a child in need have the tools to succeed in school. #### CLEVELAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Cleveland Elementary School is a year-round school, and home to approximately 380 students, grades K-6, most of whom are eligible for free breakfast and lunch. In 2014, Cleveland was chosen as our parish's focus project. Opportunities to serve this important ministry include: becoming a homework tutor; assisting the school office with administrative help; assisting the PTA; helping in the library; gardening on the weekends; joining the "lunch bunch", eating lunch with the children periodically; or serving as an advocate for the school and neighborhood at City Hall. **Volunteers are always needed.** Contact Susan Evans for more information. susanfevans@icloud.com
