The Hymnal is the blue book in the pew rack in front of you. The Lessons: You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries, or you may follow along with the scripture readings in the bulletin. The Book of Common Prayer: This smaller red book in the pew rack is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians. Prayer: You will find that some people stand in prayer while others kneel. Please do what makes you feel comfortable. Holy Communion: All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

ALL SAINTS' FOOD WAGON

We will collect food for the hungry each Sunday. Food & items that you bring for the hungry will be gathered each Sunday at the entrance in a green wagon and brought forward to the altar with our offerings and oblations to God. The food will be donated to Café Picasso Food Pantry at St. Michael's University Church (aka St. Mike's) in Isla Vista to serve UCSB and SBCC students struggling with issues of food insecurity.

All Saints Food Wagon provides us all with an opportunity to give out of our abundance. One way to do so is to try spending 10% (the biblical tithe) of your grocery bill on food that you will give away. Parents, you might invite your children weekly to choose the food that your family will bring to church to give to those who don't have enough to eat. This makes them aware of the blessings of their life and forms them at a young age to make a difference in the hurts of their world. Through this simple but loving service, both young and old can extend Christ's grace from the meal we share at the altar to our hungry neighbors' tables.

You can celebrate St. Nicholas, a truly celebrated saint, at All Saints on Dec. 6 after the 10 a.m. service at the inaugural St. Nicholas Market. The All Saints campus will be transformed into a marketplace where everything we buy will support our growing ministries to children and youth. Parishioners are invited to help by donating beautiful and desirable treasures from you or your home, or items you would like to donate. Items already secured include original pieces of art from parish artists Margaret Nadeau, Chip Nichols, Tony Askew, and Ken Jewesson. Gift items include a wine luncheon for six at the Rusack Vineyard; an airplane flight to Catalina Island for lunch with Ben Short; a catered dinner for six by Connie and Carl Lindberg; local wine tastings; books from All Saints authors; decorative door wreaths by Maureen Anderson; and much more. Keep checking back for an update of the exciting items for purchase.

Have you begun to wonder just who this St. Nicholas is? You can go to the All Saints website to find out more but you can be assured the original fellow is a bit different than the North Pole-dwelling bringer of Christmas gifts, according to the *National Geographic*. The original saint was a Greek born 280 years after Christ who became bishop of Myra, a small Roman town in modern Turkey. Nicholas was neither fat nor jolly but developed a reputation as a fiery, wiry, and defiant defender of church doctrine during the "Great Persecution," when Bibles were put to the torch and priests made to renounce Christianity or face execution. Nicholas defied these edicts and spent years in prison before Constantine brought Christianity to prominence in his empire. Nicholas's fame lived long after his death (on December 6 of some unknown year in the mid-fourth century) because he was associated with many miracles, and reverence for him continues to this day independent of his Santa Claus connection. You can revere him, too, at All Saints on Dec. 6!
