Holy Week

Holy Week begins on **TODAY** with Palm Sunday. All are lovingly invited to celebrate and participate in Holy Week at All Saints.

Palm Sunday – March 20 Palm Sunday is filled with drama and action. We join in Jesus' triumphant procession into Jerusalem, only to be surprised by the cross at the end of the journey.

Maundy Thursday – March 24 The evening will commemorate the Lord's Last Supper. A **sign-up** for the potluck supper at **5 p.m.** can be found on the Information Table after church today. We worship together at **6 p.m.** with a **service of foot washing** and Holy Eucharist. All are invited to participate in the foot washing, and share in Jesus' servant ministry, including children and youth.

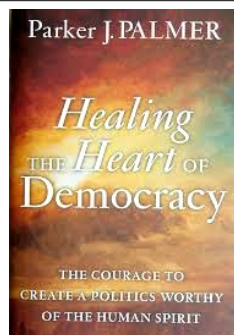
An **all night vigil** will commence immediately following the Maundy Thursday service. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend an hour with Jesus! **Sign up** today for your hour of choice at the Information Table on the patio after church!

Good Friday – March 25 We will worship together at **Noon** and **6 p.m.** During this service, we find our connection with the agony of the events of Good Friday, and we offer our thanks to God for Jesus' saving work on the cross. Another service rich in symbol, this solemn service can be very rich for children, as it teaches them the stories so central to our faith.

The Great Vigil of Easter – Saturday, March 26 We gather on the patio to light the new fire of Easter. Gathered around the fire, we'll hear the stories of God's saving works throughout history, be led from death to life, and renew our promise to be people of the resurrection. **DRESS WARMLY** and do not miss this principle service of the Christian year. Service begins at **7:30 p.m.**

Easter Day – Sunday, March 27 Come celebrate the victory of Christ's resurrection! We'll gather for a chorale Eucharist at **8 a.m.** and **10 a.m.** (**Egg Hunt follows the 10 a.m. service.**) **Don't forget to bring cut flowers for the Flower Cross on the lawn.**

"5 HABITS OF THE HEART THAT MAKE DEMOCRACY POSSIBLE"

Today we're living through a 'turning point' period in American democracy. As campaigners jockey to define the future of our government, we wonder what all this looks like when we 'put on the mind of Christ,' as St. Paul urged us to do. As a parish, we've just enacted the powerful rituals of Holy Week. We invite you to bring Easter's practice of resurrection living to an exploration of democratic values as expressed in *Healing The Heart of Democracy* by Parker Palmer. The focus of the series, Palmer's book, has been called "one of the most important books of the early 21st Century" according to the online journal Democracy & Education. We'll be reading and working with its themes. Our sessions will follow Palmer's five "Habits of the Heart" that can pattern our understanding and response to the events of today:

1. the recognition that we are all in this together
2. an appreciation of the value of 'otherness'
3. an ability to hold tensions in life-giving ways
4. a sense of authentic, personal voice and agency
5. a capacity to create and sustain genuine community

We hope you'll join us for this adventure in spiritual and political skill building. There will be **SIX** classes following the Wednesday Eventide service and suppers on April 6—20 and May 4-18. We hope to plan an optional Saturday Retreat in late spring. Please **sign up** at the Welcome Table. You can find the book at Chaucers or online. MAY THE ROAD TO IRELAND SOON GREET YOU!

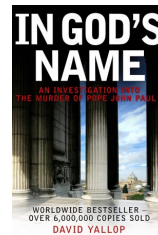
All Saints-by-the-Sea will be off to discover St. Patrick's Ireland from October 16 - 25, 2016 on a faith tour designed by Collette.

Parishioners, families, and friends are invited to join together for inspirational travel and fellowship while exploring world-famous spiritual sites in Ireland. Highlights of our trip will include Dublin, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Clonmacnoise, Westport, Knock Shrine, Galway, Croagh Patrick, Kylemore Abbey, Tobernalt Holy Well, Belleek, Belfast, Downpatrick, Armagh, and more. Our tour includes roundtrip air-fare from Los Angeles, complimentary transportation to and from LAX airport, hotel accommodations, daily breakfasts, four dinners, and all gratuities. A deposit of \$250.00 per person is due upon reservation and reservations are due April 11, 2016. Reservations made after April 11 are subject to rate increase and availability. Final payment is due by August 16, 2016. The tour price is \$3,299 for double accommodation and \$3,649 for single. Upgrades can be made for in-flight accommodations. Our next meeting of the Book Group will be on Monday, **May 9 at 6:00 p.m** in the **Parish House**. Join us for potluck dinner and discussion of *In God's Name: An Investigation into the Murder of Pope John Paul I* by David A. Yallop. "As David Yallop reveals, Pope John Paul I had, by the evening of September 28, 1978, decided on startling changes that would affect the doctrine, finances and hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church. These changes would be opposed by many, among them six powerful men who knew that the Pope's decisions could mean the end of their careers, if not their lives. Unless, of course they acted first." The pope was found dead on the morning of September 29. No official death certificate has ever been issued. No autopsy was performed. Pope Paul I died suddenly just thirty-three days after his reign of pope had begun.

VIOLENCE IN THE HOLY LAND THEN AND NOW

Religious Studies Professor, All Saint's parishioner, and new vestry member Caryn Reeder, along with Bruce Fisk, will reflect on domestic violence and wars of conquest in the Bible and in the contemporary Middle East, drawing on their work and experiences there. Caryn lived in Jerusalem from 1999-2001 and led a student program in the Middle East in 2012. She spent a year as a Fulbright Scholar in the West Bank in 2013-2014, teaching at a Palestinian university and conducting research.
