## FINDING YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SERVICE

The Hymnal is the blue book in the pew rack in front of you. The Lessons: You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries, or you may follow along with the scripture readings in the bulletin. The Book of Common Prayer: This smaller red book in the pew rack is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians. Prayer: You will find that some people stand in prayer while others kneel. Please do what makes you feel comfortable. Holy Communion: All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

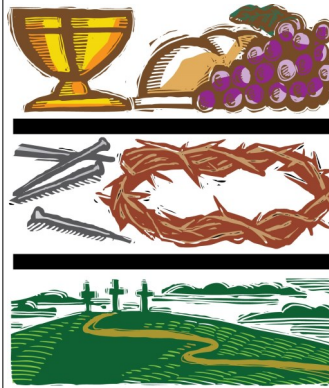
## CELEBRATE ST. PATRICK'S DAY AT ALL SAINTS!

**All Saints-by-the-Sea will be off to discover St. Patrick's Ireland from October 16 - 25, 2016 on a faith tour designed by Collette. Join Rev. Vicki Mouradian and Collette Tour representative, Tyler Reardon, for slides and discussion regarding the trip.**

Parishioners, families, and friends are invited to join together for inspirational travel and fellowship while exploring world-famous spiritual sites in Ireland. Highlights of our trip will include Dublin, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Clonmacnoise, Westport, Knock Shrine, Galway, Croagh Patrick, Kylemore Abbey, Tobernalt Holy Well, Belleek, Belfast, Downpatrick, Armagh, and more. Our tour includes roundtrip air-fare from Los Angeles, complimentary transportation to and from LAX airport, hotel accommodations, daily breakfasts, four dinners, and gratuities for tour manager and bus driver. A deposit of \$250.00 per person is due upon reservation and reservations are due April 11, 2016. Reservations made after April 11 are subject to rate increase and availability. Final payment is due by August 16, 2016. The tour price is \$3,299 for double accommodation and \$3,649 for single. Upgrades can be made for in-flight accommodations. ## OUR LENTEN WORSHIP SPACE

I was so moved the other day when I saw the Lenten transformation of our chancel. I was immediately taken to the desert to be with Jesus. I could feel my heart open. I was taken back to an arid wadi that I had walked in the Holy Land, a specific location across from where it is believed that Jesus spent his time in the wilderness. I witnessed that expanse of space at sunrise one morning. I had never been in such quiet or sat so still for so long. It felt as if I could breathe in the breath of God and exhale a vibrant energy. Not being there now, this is a wonderful next thing, a worship space which exudes a stark reminder and drama of the desert experience of Jesus. God incarnate chose such a place to grow with his father. And, I can simply walk across the street from my office and be in it. May we all experience a blessed Lent.
