# FINDING YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SERVICE

The worship bulletin will be your basic guide through this service's liturgy. Hymns: the hymn numbers are listed on the Hymn Board at the front of the church as well as in the bulletin. The Hymnal is the blue book in the pew rack in front of you. The Lessons: You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries, or you may follow along with the scripture readings in the bulletin. The Book of Common Prayer: This smaller red book in the pew rack is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians. Prayer: You will find that some people stand in prayer while others kneel. Please do what makes you feel comfortable. Holy Communion: All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

#### A NOTE ABOUT TODAY'S 10 A.M. PENTECOST SERVICE

We begin our Pentecost celebration this morning with the traditional trumpet blast of the Shofar. With it we are reminded of our ancient Hebrew ancestor's first Pentecost and we are reminded of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the New Testament Christian Community. Commonly associated with the Jewish festivals of Rosh Hashanah (Lev. 23:24, Num. 29:1) and Yom Kippur (Lev.25:9), the sound of the Shofar is often called the "first trump of the Lord."

# THE ABUNDANT TABLE ANNOUNCES FIRST-EVER SUMMER CAMP SESSIONS

The Abundant Table, a ministry based in Santa Paula, has announced that it will offer "Alive: Eco-Faith and Farm Summer Day Camp in two sessions this summer. The farm and garden-based program will engage campers ages 6 years to 12 years "in connecting farmbased learning experiences with Christian faith to feel fully alive in the tradition of relationship and love of self, community, Earth, place, and God." Learning and activity themes of soil science, watersheds, eco-systems, botany, local food systems, and healthy eating will be woven together with biblical teachings and reflection. The first session will be held Monday - Friday, July 25 -29 at The Abundant Table Farm in Camarillo. The second session will be Monday - Friday, August 8 - 12 at Community Roots Garden in Oxnard.
