FINDING YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SERVICE

The worship bulletin will be your basic guide through this service's liturgy. Hymns: the hymn numbers are listed on the Hymn Board at the front of the church as well as in the bulletin. The Hymnal is the blue book in the pew rack in front of you. The Lessons: You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries, or you may follow along with the scripture readings in the bulletin. The Book of Common Prayer: This smaller red book in the pew rack is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians. Prayer: You will find that some people stand in prayer while others kneel. Please do what makes you feel comfortable. Holy Communion: All are lovingly invited to the Lord's table.

We are very excited to announce that **Godly Play curriculum is coming to All Saints!** This curriculum will be introduced to our Sunday School, grades Pre-School through fifth grades, when we begin our new Sunday School year on September 18! Godly Play is a unique way of doing Christian Formation. Developed by Jerome Berryman, an Episcopal priest, Godly Play uses religious language, parable, sacred story, liturgical action, and wondering to help children discover the deep resources of our faith. Our Sunday School teachers and volunteers will be busy throughout August and September with Godly Play training and converting our classrooms into Godly Play space. For parents, grandparents, or others interested in learning more about the curriculum and Godly Play approach, you are welcome to visit one of our remaining training sessions: **September 16 from 6 to 9:00 p.m. followed by September 17 and 24 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** Our training sessions will be conducted on our campus by the Rev. SUMMER MUSIC – UPCOMING EVENTS

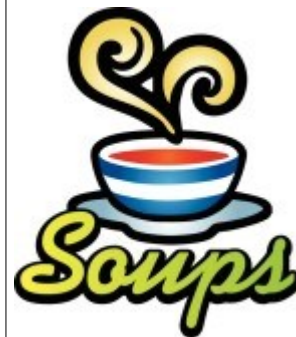
Our summer series continues through early September. This Sunday we welcome the Santa Barbara EFM singers and on September 4, our own Eventide Band will lead the music of the 10am service.

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EFM) INFORMATION MEETING HAPPENING SOON

The seminar group is the nucleus of the EFM program. A group of six to twelve participants and a trained mentor meet weekly over the course of a nine-month academic year. Through study, prayer, and reflection, EFM groups move toward a new understanding of the fullness of God's kingdom. Participants are given weekly assignments to study with the help of resource guides. Through discussion and guided reflection, the seminars furnish an opportunity to deepen understanding of the reading materials. By examining their own beliefs and their relationship to our culture and the tradition of our Christian faith, participants can learn what it means to be effective ministers in the world and in coming to terms with the notion that everything we do has potential for manifesting the love of Christ, we discover that our ministry is at hand wherever we turn. An Information Meeting is being planned for September and this date will be publicized soon.

SUMMER OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

This week's Bell Tower newsletter describes several All Saints local area outreach activities this week and next week for All Saints youth to feel good while earning community service credits and doing Jesus' work. The activities include helping to serve lunch to residents at a homeless center in SB, giving away fresh fruit and vegetables to needy families in Carp, riding with a driver who will transport dinners for low-income and disabled residents at a SB hotel, and serving dinner to homeless people in Isla Vista. CLEVELAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Cleveland Elementary School is a year-round school, and home to approximately 380 students, grades K-6, most of whom are eligible for free breakfast and lunch. In 2014, Cleveland was chosen as our parish's focus project. Opportunities to serve this important ministry include: becoming a homework tutor; assisting the school office with administrative help; assisting the PTA; helping in the library; gardening on the weekends; joining the "lunch bunch", eating lunch with the children periodically; or serving as an advocate for the school and neighborhood at City Hall.
